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USER'S GUIDE

This service keeps subscribers up to date on a weekly basis with the content and status of Bills introduced in the current legislative session. It is divided into the following four sections:

NEW THIS WEEK is a record of the week's proceedings. This section lists all Bills that in the past week have received either first, second or third reading, been reported from Committee, received Royal Assent, or been proclaimed in force. If a Bill progresses beyond one stage in a week, only the latest stage is noted. (Because they rarely become law, Private Members' Public Bills are not included unless they pass second reading. Private Members' Private Bills are not included in this bulletin service at all.)

STATUS AND SUMMARY OF CURRENT BILLS is an alphabetical list of all Bills that are either currently before the Legislature, or that have received Royal Assent. This section reports each Bill's current status and includes a summary of each Bill. A summary is included as soon as a copy of the Bill has been received. For Bills that have received Royal Assent, the "in force" dates are noted. This section is cumulative for the legislative session.

CONSEQUENTIAL AMENDMENTS is an alphabetical list of all Acts that are affected by a Royal Assent Bill, including amendments, repeals, and enactments. Such Acts will be included in this list as soon as we receive the Royal Assent copy of the Bill, which will often be several weeks after the Royal Assent date. This section is cumulative for the legislative session.

PROCLAMATIONS is a list of all Acts passed in a previous legislative session that are proclaimed in force, in whole or in part, during the current session. This section is cumulative for the legislative session.

STATUS AND SUMMARY OF CURRENT BILLS

(New summaries are in boldface.)

Accepting Schools Act, 2012 (Bill 13). Second Reading May 03, 2012. *Summary: Inter alia, Bill amends Education Act to include a definition of “bullying”, requires boards to have policies that promote a positive school climate that is inclusive and accepting of all pupils and promoting the prevention of bullying, authorizes the Minister to make policies and guidelines with respect to bullying prevention and intervention in schools, requires boards to support pupils who want to establish and lead activities or organizations that promote gender equity etc., adds to the circumstances in which a pupil must be suspended and considered for possible expulsion, certain circumstances relating to bullying and to activities that are motivated by bias, prejudice or hate.*

Alzheimer Advisory Council Act, 2012 (Bill 48). Second Reading April 26, 2012. *Summary: Act establishes the Alzheimer Advisory Council for the purpose of considering matters related to informal caregivers and persons with Alzheimer’s disease or other forms of dementia, and making recommendations to the Minister.*

Ambulance Amendment Act (Air Ambulances), 2012 (Bill 50). First Reading March 21, 2012. *Summary: Ambulance Act is amended to allow providers of air ambulance services to be designated as “designated air ambulance service*

providers". Bill provides, inter alia, that Lieutenant Governor in Council is given the power to appoint provincial representatives to sit on the board of a designated air ambulance service provider, and the Minister is given the power to issue directives to designated air ambulance service providers.

Ancient parliamentary right, Act to perpetuate (Bill 1). First Reading November 22, 2011 (pro forma Bill).

Anti-Bullying Act, 2011 (Bill 14). Second Reading March 29, 2012. *Summary: Bill amends the Education Act to deal with bullying by pupils that occurs in schools. Inter alia, Bill provides that school board is required to provide instruction on bullying prevention, Minister of Education is required to develop a model bullying prevention plan to assist school boards, and school boards are required to establish a bullying prevention plan.*

Attracting Investment and Creating Jobs Act, 2012 (Bill 11). Reported as amended April 17, 2012. *Summary: Bill requires the Minister of Economic Development and Innovation to continue the Eastern Ontario Development Fund and to establish and continue the Southwestern Ontario Development Fund to promote regional economic development in eastern Ontario and southwestern Ontario.*

Education Amendment Act (Concussions), 2012 (Bill 39). First Reading March 06, 2012. *Summary: Bill amends the Education Act. Part XIII.1 of the Act is renamed "Pupil Health" and a new section is added to it. The new section authorizes the Minister to make policies and guidelines respecting head injuries and concussions and sets out a list of matters that this power includes.*

Elephant Protection Act, 2012 (Bill 69). Second Reading May 03, 2012. *Summary: Subject to exceptions, Bill amends the Ontario Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, to prohibit the use of an electric prod, a bullhook, an ankus, a pole or a similar implement or device on an elephant, and to prohibit the use of a chain, rope or similar device to restrain an elephant.*

Ensuring Local Voices in New Casino Gambling Development Act, 2012 (Bill 76). Second Reading May 03, 2012. *Summary: Bill amends the Ontario Lottery and Gaming Corporation Act, 1999 to adopt by reference the rule set out in the current regulations made under the Act, that a casino or charity casino cannot be established in a municipality, or on a First Nation reserve, unless the electors in the municipality or the members of the council, as the case may be, approve the establishment by way of a referendum.*

Family Caregiver Leave Act (Employment Standards Amendment), 2011 (Bill 30). First Reading December 08, 2011. *Summary: Section 49.3, creating family caregiver leave, is added to the Act, entitling employee to a leave of absence (eight weeks per calendar year) without pay to provide care or support to a family member who has a serious medical condition.*

Hawkins Gignac Act (Carbon Monoxide Detectors), 2012 (Bill 20). Reported as amended April 17, 2012. *Summary: Bill amends the Building Code Act, 1992 to require owners of residential buildings that contain a fuel-burning device or a storage garage to install carbon monoxide detectors in the buildings and to maintain them in operating condition.*

Healthy Homes Renovation Tax Credit Act, 2012 (Bill 2). Reported as amended May 03, 2012. *Summary: Bill amends the Taxation Act, 2007 to implement a healthy homes renovation tax credit. The tax credit is set out in new section 103.1.1 of the Act. It is a refundable tax credit.*

Highway Traffic Amendment Act (Brake Pad Standards), 2012 (Bill 51). Second Reading April 05, 2012. *Summary: Bill amends Highway Traffic Act to require that motor vehicles, other than motorcycles, that are equipped with brake pads be equipped with brake pads that meet the prescribed standards and specifications and that do not contain asbestos.*

Imitation Firearms Regulation Amendment Act, 2011 (Bill 6). Second Reading December 08, 2011. *Summary: Bill amendments impose additional conditions on the sale of an imitation firearm. These conditions include that the purchaser must provide a description of intention regarding the use of the imitation firearm and that the purchaser must not have been convicted of a criminal offence.*

Jewish Heritage Month Act, 2012 (Bill 17). Royal Assent April 24, 2012, c. 1. Act comes into force on the day it receives Royal Assent. *Summary: Bill proclaims the month of May in each year as Jewish Heritage Month.*

Labour Relations Amendment Act (Fairness for Employees), 2012 (Bill 77). Second Reading May 03, 2012. *Summary: Bill amends the Labour Relations Act, 1995. Inter alia, Act is amended (1) to permit a trade union to ask the Ontario Labour Relations Board to direct an employer to provide the trade union with a list of employees in a bargaining unit that could be appropriate for collective bargaining, (2) Board may direct that representation votes be held at a neutral site, electronically, or by telephone, (3) successor rights provisions are extended to the contract services sector, and (4) Bill amends provision concerning making interim orders reinstating employees in certain circumstances when proceedings are pending.*

Major-General Sir Isaac Brock Day Act, 2012 (Bill 35). Royal Assent April 24, 2012, c. 2. Act comes into force on the day it receives Royal Assent. *Summary: Bill proclaims October 13 in each year as Major-General Sir Isaac Brock Day.*

New Drivers' Insurance Rate Reduction Act, 2012 (Bill 71). Second Reading April 26, 2012. *Summary: Bill requires a risk classification system used by an insurer to determine rates for automobile insurance to provide for lower rates for new drivers by crediting new drivers with additional years of driving experience.*

Non-profit Housing Co-operatives Statute Law Amendment Act, 2012 (Bill 65). First Reading April 16, 2012. *Summary: Bill amends the Co-operative Corporations Act and the Residential Tenancies Act, 2006 and makes consequential amendments to the Energy Consumer Protection Act, 2010 and the Ontario Clean Energy Benefit Act, 2010. Most of the amendments are for the purpose of creating a procedure in the Residential Tenancies Act, 2006 for non-profit housing co-operatives to regain possession of a member unit occupied by a person after his or her membership and occupancy rights in the co-operative terminate or expire.*

Ontario Electricity System Operator Act, 2012 (Bill 75). First Reading April 26, 2012. *Summary: Bill amends the Electricity Act, 1998 by amalgamating the Independent Electricity System Operator ("IESO") and the Ontario Power*

Authority (“OPA”) and by continuing them as the Ontario Electricity System Operator (“OESO”). The board of directors of the OESO is required to ensure that there is an effective separation of functions and activities of the OESO relating to its market operations and its procurement and contract management activities.

Ontario Forestry Industry Revitalization Act (Height of Wood Frame Buildings), 2012 (Bill 52). Second Reading April 19, 2012. *Summary: Bill amends the Building Code Act, 1992 to provide that the building code shall not prohibit a building that is six storeys or less in building height from being of wood frame construction.*

Ontario One Call Act, 2011 (Bill 8). Second Reading December 01, 2011. *Summary: Ontario One Call Ltd. is a corporation currently operating in Ontario. Ontario One Call Ltd. provides information to excavators and homeowners about the location of underground infrastructure. The Act continues the Corporation and requires that the persons or entities specified in the Act become members of the Corporation and provide information to it.*

Ontario Underground Infrastructure Notification System Act, 2012 (Bill 8). Reported as amended May 01, 2012. Summary: Ontario One Call provides information to excavators about the location of underground infrastructure. The Act continues the Corporation and requires that the persons or entities specified in the Act become members of the Corporation and provide information to it.

Ontario’s Wood First Act, 2012 (Bill 61). Second Reading April 19, 2012. *Summary: Bill enacts the Ontario’s Wood First Act, 2012 to provide that specified provincially funded buildings must be constructed using wood as the primary building material. It also provides the Minister with various powers to promote the use of wood in the construction of buildings. The Bill also amends the Building Code Act, 1992 to provide that the building code shall allow a building that is six storeys or less in building height to be of wood frame construction.*

Protection of Minors in Amateur Sports Act, 2011 (Bill 24). Second Reading April 26, 2012. *Summary: Bill enacts a new Act with respect to amateur sports programs in which persons under 18 years of age may participate. An organizer of such a program is required to obtain a copy of the criminal record from a police force for every person who acts in a position in the program that involves dealing with persons under 18 years of age on a regular basis, whether or not the position is for remuneration.*

Public Safety Related to Dogs Statute Law Amendment Act, 2011 (Bill 16). Second Reading February 23, 2012. *Summary: Bill repeals provisions in the Animals for Research Act relating to the disposition of pit bulls under that Act. The Bill also repeals provisions in the Dog Owners’ Liability Act that prohibit restricted pit bulls and provide for controls on pit bulls.*

Reducing Automobile Insurance Premiums by Eliminating Fraud Act, 2012 (Bill 41). Second Reading March 22, 2012. *Summary: Bill provides protection against retaliation for persons who disclose, to specified entities, information relating to another person’s activity in connection with automobile insurance*

claims. Bill also provides for investigations of members of health profession colleges to determine whether a member has been involved in fraudulent activity in connection with automobile insurance claims.

Registered Human Resources Professionals Act, 2012 (Bill 28). Second Reading March 01, 2012. *Summary: The Bill repeals the Human Resources Professionals Association of Ontario Act, 1990 and enacts the Registered Human Resources Professionals Act, 2011. The new Act continues the Human Resources Professionals Association of Ontario, a corporation without share capital. The objects of the Association include promoting and protecting the public interest by governing and regulating the practice of its members.*

Residential Tenancies Amendment Act (Rent Increase Guideline), 2011 (Bill 19). First Reading December 06, 2011. *Summary: Bill amends s.120 of the Residential Tenancies Act, 2006 so that annual rent increase guideline, which is linked to the Consumer Price Index for Ontario, shall be not less than 1 per cent and not more than 2.5 per cent.*

Retail Sales Tax Amendment Act (HST Rebate for Home Heating), 2011 (Bill 4). Second Reading November 24, 2011. *Summary: Bill amends the Retail Sales Tax Act to provide for a rebate in respect of the Ontario portion of the Harmonized Sales Tax for the supply of energy sources used for home heating, equipment used for home heating and services related to home heating. Bill provides that rebate is available only if the Comprehensive Integrated Tax Coordination Agreement between Ontario and Canada is amended accordingly.*

Security for Courts, Electricity Generating Facilities and Nuclear Facilities Act, 2012 (Bill 34). Second Reading March 20, 2012. *Summary: Bill repeals the Public Works Protection Act, amends the Police Services Act with respect to court security and enacts the Security for Electricity Generating Facilities and Nuclear Facilities Act, 2012.*

Strong Action for Ontario Act (Budget Measures), 2012 (Bill 55). First Reading March 27, 2012. *Summary: Bill to implement Budget measures and to enact and amend various Acts.*

Supply Act, 2012 (Bill 46). Royal Assent April 24, 2012, c. 3. Act is deemed to have come into force on April 1, 2011. *Summary: Act to authorize the expenditure of certain amounts for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2012.*

Wireless Phone, Smart Phone and Data Service Transparency Act, 2011 (Bill 5). Second Reading December 01, 2011. *Summary: Act applies to future performance agreements in respect of wireless telephone, smart phone or data services, whether entered into before or after the Act comes into force, if the consumer or the supplier is located in Ontario when the agreement is entered into. Act deals with topics such as plain language in agreements, required service and cost information, technological restriction features, agreement amendments requiring express consent of consumer, and consumer being able to cancel agreement on 30 days notice.*

Wireless Services Agreements Act, 2012 (Bill 82). First Reading May 03, 2012. *Summary: Bill enacts a new Act to govern wireless agreements. The Act sets out disclosure obligations for suppliers under a wireless agreement. A consumer is allowed to cancel a wireless agreement at any time and without any reason. The Act sets limits on cancellation fees that the supplier is allowed to charge.*

Child and Family Services Amendment Act (Child Welfare Reform), 1999, c. 2. December 20, 2011 as the day on which subsection 2 (3) of the Child and Family Services Amendment Act (Child Welfare Reform), 1999, c. 2, comes into force.

Good Government Act, 2009, c. 33. Order in Council 1105/2011 directed the issuance of a proclamation in respect of the Good Government Act, 2009. The proclamation, issued on May 30, 2011, names March 1, 2012 as the day on which certain provisions of Schedule 4 to the Act come into force. An amendment changing that date is desired. Therefore, we, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of Ontario, amend the proclamation issued on May 30, 2011 in respect of the Good Government Act, 2009, c. 33, by striking out “March 1, 2012” and substituting “March 31, 2012”.

Good Government Act, 2011, c. 1. Order in Council 1106/2011 directed the issuance of a proclamation in respect of the Good Government Act, 2011. The proclamation, issued on May 30, 2011, names March 1, 2012 as the day on which certain provisions of Schedule 1 to the Act come into force. An amendment changing that date is desired. Therefore, we, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of Ontario, amend the proclamation issued on May 30, 2011 in respect of the Good Government Act, 2011, c. 1, by striking out “March 1, 2012” and substituting “March 31, 2012”.

Government Process Simplification Act (Ministry of Health), 1997, c. 15. December 31, 2011 as the day on which section 6 of the Government Process Simplification Act (Ministry of Health), 1997, c. 15, which amends the Homemakers and Nurses Services Act, comes into force.

Long-Term Care Act, 1994, c. 26. December 31, 2011 as the day on which the following provisions of the Long-Term Care Act, 1994, c. 26, come into force:
1. Section 71, which amends the Health Protection and Promotion Act. 2. Section 72, which amends the Homemakers and Nurses Services Act.

Occupational Health and Safety Statute Law Amendment Act, 2011, c. 11. April 1, 2012 as the day on which sections 13, 14 and 16 and subsections 17 (1) and 18 (4) of the Occupational Health and Safety Statute Law Amendment Act, 2011, c. 11, which amend the Occupational Health and Safety Act, come into force.

Ontario College of Trades and Apprenticeship Act, 2009, c. 22. January 1, 2012 as the day on which sections 10 and 11, subsections 21 (1) to (4) and sections 60 and 61 of the Ontario College of Trades and Apprenticeship Act, 2009, c. 22, come into force.

Red Tape Reduction Act, 1999, c. 12. December 30, 2011 as the day on which sections 30, 31 and 32 of Schedule F to the Red Tape Reduction Act, 1999, c. 12, which amend the Marriage Act, come into force... // ... December 31, 2011 as the day on which subsection 4 (4) of Schedule B to the Red Tape Reduction Act, 1999, c. 12, which amends the Courts of Justice Act, comes into force... // ... December 31, 2011 as the day on which Schedule D to the Red Tape Reduction Act, 1999, c. 12, being the Settlement of International Investment Disputes Act, 1999, comes into force.

Red Tape Reduction Act, 2000, c. 26. December 30, 2011 as the day on which subsection 5 (2) of Schedule B to the Red Tape Reduction Act, 2000, c. 26, which amends the Change of Name Act, comes into force.

Retirement Homes Act, 2010, c. 11 . (a) April 15, 2012 as the day on which sections 34 to 49, 52, 106, 107 and 110, subsection 124 (2) and section 125 of the Retirement Homes Act, 2010, c. 11, come into force; (b) July 1, 2012 as the day on which sections 33, 50, 51, 53 and 54, subsection 55 (1), sections 56, 58 and 59, subsections 60 (3), (4) and (5), section 61, subsections 63 (1) and 65 (1), (2) and (3), section 67, subsections 68 (1), (2) and (3) and sections 69, 71, 73, 74, 89 to 97, 100 to 105, 108 and 109 of the Act come into force; (c) January 1, 2013 as the day on which section 57, subsections 60 (1) and (2), section 62, subsections 63 (2) and (3) and section 128 of the Act come into force; (d) July 1, 2013 as the day on which subsections 65 (4) and (5) and sections 66 and 72 of the Act come into force; and (e) January 1, 2014 as the day on which sections 64 and 81 to 88 of the Act come into force.

Securing Pension Benefits Now and for the Future Act, 2010, c. 24. January 1, 2012 as the day on which subsection 38 (1) of the Securing Pension Benefits Now and for the Future Act, 2010, c. 24, which amends the Pension Benefits Act, comes into force.

Statute Law Amendment Act (Government Management and Services), 1994, c. 27. December 30, 2011 as the day on which subsection 79 (2) of the Statute Law Amendment Act (Government Management and Services), 1994, c. 27, which amends the Corporations Information Act, comes into force.

Workplace Safety and Insurance Amendment Act, 2008, c. 20. January 1, 2012 as the day on which section 9 of the Workplace Safety and Insurance Amendment Act, 2008, c. 20, comes into force.

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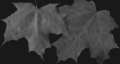
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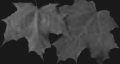
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
